

Calestous Juma is Professor of the Practice of International Development and Director of the Science, Technology, and Globalization Project at Harvard Kennedy School. He also directs the School's Agricultural Innovation in Africa Project funded by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. He is a former Executive Secretary of the UN Convention on Biological Diversity, founding Executive Director of the African Centre for Technology Studies in Nairobi and founder of the Victoria Institute of Science and Technology (Kenya). He co-chaired the African High-Level Panel on Modern Biotechnology of the African Union. He has been elected to several scientific academies including the Royal Society of London, the US National Academy of Sciences, the Academy of Sciences for the Developing World (TWAS), the UK Royal Academy of Engineering and the African Academy of Sciences. Among others, he serves on the boards of the One Laptop per Child Foundation and WWF International. Juma holds a DPhil in science and technology policy studies from the University of Sussex (UK) and has received several international awards and honorary degrees for his work on sustainable development. His recent publications include *Freedom to Innovate: Biotechnology in Africa's Development.*; and *Engineering Change: Towards a Sustainable Future in the Developing World.* He is editor of the peer-reviewed *International Journal of Technology and Globalisation* and the *International Journal of Biotechnology.*
